The Talmud specifies three things that parents must teach their children. Torah; How to make a living; and How to swim. (Talmud, Kiddushin 29a.)

The Torah we present to children includes many different qualities of the spirit: empathy, helping others, honoring parents, respect for our teachers and authority

figures, learning religious skills and being responsible and hard working.

Parents teach children how to make a living so that they learn responsibility, become independent and remain honest. Without suitable work skills one could become a burden to society.

Our sages suggest that teaching a child how to swim was important even though the ancient Talmudic societies were located away from the ocean. Indeed the rabbis understood it as a metaphor for good parenting. As a community we continue to offer the youngest among us the tools to become active members of our community and committed Jews.

Our synagogue, and its many points of entry, is dedicated to making your journey worthy of your effort and filled with true meaning. As such we are on a constant search for better and more profound ways to live Judaism. Indeed, change is the norm at Temple Beth El. A new Hazzan and family have arrived. We welcome Hazzan Levin, Emily, Henry and Michael. We already feel the new and young energy they are bringing to Temple.

President's Letter



Dear Temple Beth El Community,

When I began my term as President in May I remarked that to lead is a privilege and that I am truly appreciative of the opportunity to serve Temple Beth El in this capacity. That said, leadership is not about titles or positions; it is about one life influencing another and seizing opportunities to make a difference.

Maintaining balance between tradition and change is a delicate, thoughtful process. As a leadership team, the Officers and Board, Executive Director, and clergy, we are driven by a vision of what Temple Beth El can mean to its members and congregants. It is through the efforts of our dedicated staff and volunteers that we have been able to accomplish so much and lay the groundwork for an exciting year ahead.

Over the past year, Keshet led by Mandi Warner, saw increased enrollment and a vibrant, energetic summer camp. For 2018/2019, the early childhood program will expand to include Grades K - 2 to offer a more robust educational experience for our students and families.

Jody Dietz spent the summer focused on a plan to refresh Limmud. I am enthusiastically looking forward to her leading the implementation of new curriculum and programming for students in Grades 3 - 7, and learning and experiential opportunities for our teens. This will be the first of a phased, multi-year evolution of our religious school.

Our L'Dor V'Dor Giving Society, in partnership with the Life & Legacy program of the Harold Grinspoon Foundation and the Foundation of the Jewish Federation of Rochester, has made great strides in their work related to planned giving. Please let us know if you are interested in learning more about making a planned gift to ensure life of the temple continues to flourish.

Temple Beth El continues to bring people together to meet the spiritual and social needs of Jewish Rochester and the broader community. Building upon our commitment to inclusion, we recently celebrated our first Pride Shabbat and fielded a team to participate in the 2018 ROC Pride 5K. Our Tikkun Olam Committee maintains its work with the Refugee Resettlement Program, with Asbury First, serving meals to those in need, and with the RAIHN program to aid homeless families in the Rochester area.

Transitions are occasions for renewal and we started a new chapter in the history of Temple Beth El by welcoming Hazzan Randall Levin and his family to our shul and to Rochester in July.

We continue to explore how our members wish to connect with one another with specific interest in understanding what volunteer opportunities our congregants may wish to lead and/or help support. Please contact me or Debbie Zeger directly—we look forward to hearing from you!

Lastly, the quiet period of our Vision 2020 Campaign is well underway and excitement building for the remodeling of our sanctuary for the next generation. Expect to hear more as we make our way through the High Holiday season.
