RABBI'S CORNER

Mishenikhnas Adar Marbin B'simchah says in our tradition, from the moment Adar arrives, we increase our joy. The mood already begins to change in anticipation of Purim February 25.

Shabbat Shekalim is the first of four Shabbatot before Passover. We read about the obligation on every Israelite to contribute a half Shekel to support the tabernacle and to be able to run a census. During Temple times it was an annual tax paid during Adar. Today we collect funds to support Jewish institutions and to fund charitable endeavors.

Today is also Rosh Hodesh Adar and therefore we use one Torah for Parashat Mishpatim, a second Torah for Rosh Hodesh Adar and a third Torah for Shabbat Shekalim.
