RABBI'S CORNER

Once a year, on what came to be known as the Day of Atonement, Aaron was to enter the Holy of Holies to atone for the sins of the priesthood and the entire congregation. Suitably cleansed and dressed in white, he took he-goats for a sin-offering and a ram for a burnt-offering; one of the goats was sacrificed, while the other was sent into the wilderness as a symbol that the community's sin and guilt had been expunged.

Aaron also sacrificed a bullock as a sin-offering on his own behalf. Then, having filled a censer with burning coals from the altar, he gathered a handful of incense, entered the Holy of Holies and "put the incense of the fire before the Lord."

The Almighty's manual of moral instruction dealt with the relationship between humans and God and between people. Included were laws relating to honoring one's parents, keeping the Sabbath, idol worship, helping the poor, loving one's neighbor, mixing cattle, seeds and material, the prompt payment of wages, impartiality in dispensing justice and honesty with weights and measures.
