RABBI'S CORNER

In anticipation of the conquest of the “Promised Land,” Moses sends an investigation commission to report on the land. Moses sends 12 spies to report on the land. Ten return with a negative report (Nu 13:33) “We were in our own sight as grasshoppers and so we were in their sight.” The Kotzker Rebbe said that the mistake of the spies was in the words “and so we were in their sight.” Why should it have worried the spies how the indigenous population would view them? Their mission was to report on how strong was the indigenous population. Their pessimistic summation results in the punishment of that entire generation of former slaves. The people murmur against God and Moses again. Moses’ anger comes to the forefront. Also included at the end of this parsha is the ordinance for “taking” challah and the command to wear “tzitzits,” or fringes on our garments.
