**Vaccinations:**

- We will now require anyone 5 or older entering the building to provide proof of vaccination or a recent negative COVID test (within 48 hours).
- To be considered fully vaccinated, those eligible must provide the date of a booster shot.
- Proof of vaccination can be in the form of: A vaccination card (or copy or photo of one) An Excelsior pass. Your updated vaccination information can be uploaded to <https://tberochester.shulcloud.com/form/vaccine-status1.html> or shown at the door.

**Masks:**

- Everyone entering the building must wear a mask at all times.

**Daily Services:**

- Until further notice the only services that will be held in person at Temple Beth El are services that include Torah reading:
  - Monday and Thursday morning minyan at 7:30 a.m.
  - Rosh Chodesh morning minya 7:15 a.m.
  - Shabbat morning services at 9:30 a.m
  - Shabbat Mincha/Maariv services

**Food**

- This will include any scheduled Friday night dinners, breakfast after morning minyan and Kiddush on Shabbat
