FROM THE DESK OF THE SENIOR RABBI



A Time of Trouble is a Time for Growth.

Adversity can be the path of growth we need. I am writing my article during a time of deep crisis in Israel. I want to think positively. I want to believe that the "fine piece of china" needs to be exposed to searing flame before it emerges shaped, strong and beautiful.

We all suffer losses of various degrees throughout life. We are going through one the most difficult periods of suffering for Israelis. As painful as it is, the Jewish soul is also facing the opportunity to get in touch with the depths of God's divinity in the universe, which gives hope and courage in return.

Tens of thousands of protestors have taken to the streets across Israel in a rare show of defiance against the prime minister over his controversial plans to overhaul the judiciary. Is it necessary to do it? I believe so. Like most things we face is not about what we need to do but how it should be done.

A known parable comes to mind. This is the parable of the two wood choppers who had taken down a tree that was over one hundred years old. Looking at the growth rings to determine the tree's age, the younger woodchopper noticed that there were five very narrow rings, concluding that there had been a five-year drought, during which the tree had shown very little growth. However, the other lumber person, wiser perhaps, with a philosophical bent, had a different view point. The dry years actually were the most significant in the tree's history. Because of the drought, the tree had to force its roots down farther to get the water and the minerals it needed. With a strengthened root system, it was able to grow after and taller when conditions improved.

Israel will survive it's current crisis. It is precisely at these times of turmoil and division that Israel and us in the diaspora must grow inwardly. If we do, we will be amazed at how we can expand our horizons when the conditions of the State of Israel judiciary system gets resolved. And a new unity among Israel's citizens is born.

Kohelet, the book of Ecclesiastes which we read during Sukkot says. "It is better to go to a House of Mourning that to a House of Rejoicing, for in the House of Mourning one is able to learn so much more." We obvoiusly don't want to experience a house of mourning, but if we need to bury old traditions of systems of government, we then shall learn from that experience how to make Israel a better democracy for minorities and the majority.

It has been proven that what finally makes people succeed in spite of the circumstances is not the drive for power, or sex, rather the power of finding meaning in life. The search for meaning is the profound truth that has kept us alive. In the words of Nietzsche: "If you have a why to live for, you can bear with any how."

Thousands of years ago we received meaning in our lives with the giving of the Torah and Land of Israel. It has accompanied us throughout our lives. Israel will find its new way to run its three branches of power that respects the will of the people. There and in the diaspora, the Jewish people will continue searching for meaning and it will continue to be a light unto the nations.

They were given their Siddurim with messages of lifelong learning blessed on them. It was extremely meaningful to all who were able to attend.

Things have not been quiet on the Keshet and Early Childhood side of things either! Our Keshet students had a very busy Passover as we brought the Model Matzah Bakery to them! Rabbi Hirsh and Rabbi Lagunov came to Keshet and taught our students how to make matzah and the importance of it. Then, a few days later, the students used their own matzah for their model Passover Seder! Each class was able to learn about the holiday and traditions by doing various activities including making their own Haggadahs, "reading from them" and making their own Haroset.

We are looking forward to several events coming up. Camp Keshet is almost completely full, and we are excited for new themes, new activities, and new guests for Watermelon Wednesday. One new guest for Watermelon Wednesday is Grace and Grimms puppetry who will be doing a special show about motion in the ocean! We will bring back a lot of favorites including Butterfly Kids Yoga, Soccer Shots, and Moreh Josh from Tikya Music. Our Sisterhood is actively working on a series of projects to enhance our Temple community, and our standing in the Rochester Jewish community. **Tikkun Olan** means many things to us, among them: **Diversity – Equity – The Environment – Sustainability.** Here are some examples of how we are trying to live our values. Just Judaica, our Temple gift shop, is the largest retail Judaica gift shop in western and central New York. Many items are created by artists and craftspersons for us, and not available on the internet. We also sell high quality personalized kippot and ketubahs at below-internet prices. Plan your own personal shopping experience - call Lynda (585-314-8288) or Iris (585-739-2428) to set up yours. Normal shopping hours are Tuesdays 2-4.

The P.A.D. Project involves collecting feminine hygiene products, and distributing them to needy teens and women in the Rochester area. We hold "PAD Parties" twice a year, to pack the products for monthly use. A collection barrel is located outside the Chapel, so please drop off products whenever you can. We also invite you to send donations to TBE Sisterhood, and we will purchase products for you.

Shiva Packages contain a collection of items that we hope will be of help to the grieving family as they "sit shiva". We deliver a Shiva Package to Temple Beth El members who are sitting shiva in the Rochester area.

Food Collection and **Clothing Collection** boxes are always available, located outside the Chapel. Food is delivered to the Brighton Food Cupboard and the Irondequoit Community Cupboard. Clothing goes to Brighton Your Wardrobe.

We support the Torah Fund campaign, which provides scholarships and programs in the worldwide Conservative/Masorti institutes of higher Jewish learning. Through this dedicated philanthropy, we help insure that Rabbis and other professional clergy continue to provide services to our synagogues. Annually, a pin (pictured in photo) is given to thank those who generously give at the donor level.


